• Long before you face a problem, God already has a plan.

The crowd joined in the attack against Paul and Silas. And the magistrates ordered them to be stripped and beaten with rods. After they had been severely flogged, they were thrown into prison and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. Acts 16:22-23

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Acts 16:25

Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone's chains came loose. Acts 16:26

Word and Reflection

- Read Psalm 37:39. Why do you think it's sometimes hard to accept that God miraculously intervenes with protection and at other times does not?

- Read Acts 16:22-26. What do you see in this story that you can start living out? What's your first step?
- Read Psalm 91 and Hebrews 13:15. What problems and pain are you currently experiencing? What are some ways God could be working them together for your good? What are you currently praying for protection from? How can we pray with you about it?
