- Read Ephesians 5:15-16. Why is our natural tendency to ask God to get us out
 of crisis instead of inviting God into our crisis? What would it look like to invite
 God into your current situation and step up to God's call? What opportunities
 do you have to bring God's light into the world in this current crisis?
- Read John 20:19-21 & Isaiah 6:8. What are some ways you can go (responsibly, carefully) to show and share the love of Jesus with others this week? To whom is God 'sending' you (in keeping with the social distancing guidelines)? How does knowing that Jesus, who conquered all your enemies and is with you, give you peace and influence your faith whether there's a crisis or not?
- Take some time to prayerfully invite God into this crisis, declaring His praise and praying the prayer points detailed on the message notes with your group.
