Then some of the Pharisees and teachers of the law said to him, "Teacher, we want to see a sign from you." ³⁹ He answered, "A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a sign! But none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. ⁴⁰ For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. ⁴¹ The men of Nineveh will stand up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and now something greater than Jonah is here. Word and Reflection

Jesus' opponents asked Him for a sign and Jesus responded by referring to the story of Jonah. Nineveh responded to Jonah's message with repentance – a turning away from their evil ways. Jesus' message is greater than Jonah's. He came to pay the price for our sins. On the cross, Jesus gave us what we needed the most, but deserved the least.

- Which part of the message made an impact, caught your attention or challenged you?
- Read Matthew 12:38-41. How was Jesus' message and life greater than Jonah's? Why do you think Jesus made a point to emphasize how the people of Nineveh responded to Jonah's message? How are you responding to Jesus' message and life?
- Read Luke 22:39-44. Discuss the final week of Jesus' life and all the pain He
 endured for you. Reflect on the betrayal, the accusations and suffering. How
 does this increase your gratitude for the enormous price Christ paid so you
 could be forgiven by God?
- Read Romans 3:23 and 1 Peter 3:18. Think about the price Jesus paid when He died on the cross for you and bore your sins. What does that mean to you? Have you turned to Jesus and experienced God's forgiveness in your life? If not, what's hindering you?

Action

- Forgiveness of sins is our greatest need. Take a step to surrender your heart to Jesus and receive the forgiveness of sins. Then, follow Him.
