The Stockdale Paradox:

- To never give up hope
- To never deceive yourself about current reality

The brutal fact is that when sin entered into the world, death came in right along with it.

The message of Jesus was a message of hope that never lost sight of the fact that sin and death was making its way through the world.

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. ²His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" ³ "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. ⁴As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. ⁵While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." John 9:1-5

We have a hope tethered to the brutal fact that sin has impacted the entire world.

Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned... Romans 5:12

Our hope is in Jesus who came to address the ultimate issue - sin that separates us from God.

For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ! Romans 5:17

- Read Hebrews 4:14-16. What stands out to you from these scriptures? According to verse 14, why should we remain faithful during seasons of suffering? According to verse 16, what can we expect from God during seasons of suffering?
