

## **Dangerous Prayers**

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. <sup>3</sup> And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." <sup>4</sup> At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. <sup>5</sup> "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." <sup>6</sup> Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. <sup>7</sup> With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." <sup>8</sup> Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? #### Let's Talk About It

In Isaiah 6, Isaiah encounters the holiness and glory of God, and that moment changes everything. Seeing who God truly is helps him see himself clearly — broken, unworthy, and in need of grace. But when God forgives and cleanses him, Isaiah's response is immediate: "Here am I. Send me." The prayer "Send Me" is a declaration of surrender and availability. It's saying, "God, I'm willing to go wherever You lead — even when it's uncomfortable or unknown." When we've experienced God's presence and grace, we can't help but respond with our lives.

Isaiah 6:1-8

#### Discussion questions:

- Which part of the message impacted or challenged you?
- Read Isaiah 6:1-8. Isaiah's encounter with God completely changed his perspective. How has experiencing God's presence or grace changed the way you see yourself or your purpose?
- Before Isaiah could be sent, he first had to be cleansed. Why do you think surrender and repentance come before calling?
- What keeps people from saying, "Here am I, send me" (fear, comfort, uncertainty, feeling unqualified...)?
- When you think about your own life, where might God be inviting you to say yes right now? It could be a relationship, a ministry, a need, or an act of obedience. How might your "yes" to God impact the people around you?

## Take a Step

This week, take a few minutes each day to pray this simple but powerful prayer: "God, I'm available. Use me however You want." Then, pay attention — look for moments where God might be prompting you to serve, encourage, or share hope with someone. Be ready to respond with faith and courage.

## Here's My Prayer

God, thank You for Your grace that forgives and transforms me. Like Isaiah, I stand in awe of who You are and what You've done for me. Today, I say yes — here I am, Lord, send me. Use my life to bring Your hope, love, and truth to the world around me. Give me courage to go where You lead and faith to trust You with the outcome. In Jesus' name, amen.
