Reflection Questions (Understanding the Passage)

1. What stands out most to you from this passage or message?
 - If needed: What caught your attention or felt significant?
2. In Jesus' illustration, how does the shepherd differ from the thieves and robbers?
 - If needed: What are their motives? How do they treat the sheep?
3. What does Jesus mean when He says, "I am the door"?
 - If needed: What role does the door play in the life of the sheep?
4. What makes Jesus the Good Shepherd according to this passage?
 - If needed: Why is laying down His life such a big deal?
5. What does Jesus mean by "my sheep hear my voice"?
 - If needed: Why don't the sheep follow strangers?

Application Questions (Personal Response)

6. What does it look like in your life to actually "hear" and respond to Jesus' voice?
 - If needed: What practices or habits help you recognize His leading?
7. The sermon talked about "walking through the door." Have you made that decision to trust and follow Jesus?
 - If needed: What does that decision practically involve?
8. What are some "voices" in your life right now competing with Jesus' voice?
 - If needed: Distractions, culture, fear, busyness, other influences?
9. Where might you be struggling to trust that Jesus is a good shepherd?

- If needed: Has anything made it difficult to follow Him fully?

10. What is one specific step you can take this week to follow the Shepherd more closely?

- If needed: Think small, practical, and realistic.
