

# Talk it Over: Heroes, Week 3

August 21-22, 2021 Looking back at the message this weekend, what was the key thought for you?

## **Key Scripture**

## **Key Thoughts**

What are you **ALWAYS** doing?

Faithful Servants

## **Start Talking**

Check in with one another. Ask how everyone is doing. (If you're working through the talk it over as an individual, reach out to someone to check in with them and share how you are doing.)

Who is your favorite superhero? Why?

## **Start Thinking**

Pastor Troy shared about the recent baptisms, offering, and sign ups for I Love Steamboat month and said "This is how the church should always be. We should always be growing, giving, and serving." As part of the body, which of these areas might God be inviting you to grow in?

If somebody were to describe you using the word "always", what would they say about you? How would you answer the question, "What are you always doing?" What does that say about who you are and what you value?

God trusted David with the big things because of his faithfulness and serving in the little things. What little things might God be inviting you to be more faithful in? What are the big things that our faithfulness in the little things could unlock?

Pastor Troy gave the example of the donkey's owner giving what he had. What talents, gifts, skills, resources, possessions, etc. do you have that could serve others?

Whose feet might God be metaphorically (or literally) inviting you to wash?

## **Start Sharing**

Pastor Troy listed several examples of people in our church who are dedicated to serving. Share about a person you know who is always serving others.

What are some things that can keep us from serving as often as we should? How can we work to overcome those obstacles and step into serving more often?

Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem was humble. He humbly washed his disciples' feet. He humbled himself by taking on the nature of a man and being obedient to the point of death on a cross (Philippians 2:5-8 paraphrased). Why is humility such an important trait for us to have as his disciples?

## **Start Praying**

Pray that God would help us to be more like sheep and less like self-promoting, self-serving goats.

Pray that he would help us to deny ourselves in order to serve others more.

Pray that he would give us eyes to see the opportunities to serve those around us, especially the least of these.

## **Start Doing**
