Every year at our church we teach a "Next Steps" Sunday School class called **How to Study the Bible** illustrating fifteen ______ that should guide personal and corporate Bible study. Every sermon that is preached from every pulpit at our church (*including our children's ministry*) utilizes these factors of Bible study. God's Book is not to be trifled with or misinterpreted (2 Pet. 1:20). Today we are going to look at one of these factors in particular as it will be greatly employed in our next expositional book study from the Bible which will begin in two weeks.

1. There are Three Basic Dimensions (3-D) or Applications to All Scripture:

Historical...There is a historical, _____ context to every passage in Scripture – Rom. 15:4.

Devotional...There are many personal, _____ applications for us from every Scripture – 1 Cor. 10:1-10; 2 Tim. 3:16.

Doctrinal...God uses historical events to teach eternal truths and even ______ events – Jn. 5:39, 46-47; Ecc. 1:9-10, 3:15; 1 Cor. 2:10-13.

Key: You must consider the _____ context of any Scripture first before you can make other applications. The historical (literal) element guides all other applications.

2. Jonah & the Whale in 3-D (*applying this factor*) – Jonah 1:1 - 2:2

*Historical…*Jonah was a prophet of God who preached to the northern kingdom when Israel was ______ – 2 Kings 14:23-25.

Devotional...Jonah, God's servant, rebelled and _____ from God, but God pursued him – 1 Pet. 1:23; Rom. 10:17; Lk. 8:15, 11:28; Gal. 5:7; Heb. 12:5-13; Pr. 16:9; 2 Cor. 4:3, 5:20; Rom. 13:11-14.

Doctrinal...Jesus ______ His death and resurrection to Jonah's story – Matt. 12:39-42, 16:4; Ps. 11:6, 50:3-4; Tit. 3:5; Eph. 2:8-9; Acts 4:10-12.
