We conclude Colossians 1 today which is about the fulness of Jesus Christ in all things (v. 19). Last week, we saw His reconciling of all things in heaven and earth and in every individual who trusts completely in His reconciling work on the cross (v. 20-21). Today, Paul concludes the discussion about his and our personal gospel ministry...bringing lost souls to see and understand the cross of Jesus Christ. Many Christians, though truly saved, will finish their course in this life and yet fail in their mission...not having the gospel \_\_\_\_\_\_ as an integral part of their own life...simply moving away from it (v. 23, 25; 2 Cor. 5:18-20).
