In Matthew, we journeyed with the King from His incarnation into humanity until His death, resurrection, and promise of a glorious return. The twelve apostles and newly appointed apostle Paul journeyed throughout the world at that time spreading the gospel and establishing and strengthening God's churches. Paul was imprisoned in Rome for his Christian beliefs, writing and dispersing several NT books, including this book of Colossians (Col. 4:3, 18). Colossians is written _____ years after the events of the gospel of Matthew.
