A NEW Jerusalem – Revelation 21:2, 9-27

1.	New Jerusalem is "new" because it replaces Old Jerusalem. It is called the "bride of the Lamb" – v. 9				
	- Christ's bride (the Lamb) is the New Testament church and New Jerusalem is the everlasting home and destination for Christ's bride – Eph. 5:22-32; Rom. 7:4; 2 Cor. 11:2-3; Jn. 14:1-6; Rev. 3:12.				
	- The devil has a bride which is also a citycalled Babylon, a mother of – Rev. 17:1-9.				
2.	New Jerusalem is called "that great city" sitting above in the 3 rd Heaven – v. 2, 10; Gal. 4:26.				
3.	The Physical Description of New Jerusalem – v. 11-23				
	- It is lit by the glory of God shining through it as a clear crystal stone jasper – v. 11.				
	 It has four sides, three guarded gates (angels) on each side, a tribe of Israel written above each gate – v. 12-13. 				
	- There are twelve foundations to the walls and in those foundations the names of the twelve apostles of Jesus Christ – v. 14.				
	- The measurements depict a 1,500 mile long cubic shaped structure to the city – v. 15-17.				
	Note: The measures were taken from the angel's measurements, as that of a (v. 17)				
	- The city is "garnished" with all manner of precious stones in its construction – v. 18-21.				
	The wall itself is constructed of jasper stone				
	The city structures are constructed of pure clear gold				
	The 12 foundations are garnished with 12 precious stones: jasper, sapphire, chalcedony, emerald, sardonyx, sardius, chrysolite, beryl, topaz, chrysoprasus, jacinth, and amethyst				
	The gates are constucted of				
	The streets are constructed of pure, gold				
	- There is no temple in New Jerusalem – v. 22.				
	- There is abundant light without need for the sun or moon to shine in New Jerusalem – v. 23.
