In the first section of Colossians 2, Paul describes his great conflict for the churches of Colosse, Laodicea, and all likeminded churches (v. 1) because of false doctrines, philosophies, and rudiments of the world that were going to come against the great salvation they had believed and received through Jesus Christ. They were at risk of being enticed by words and ______ deceptions. He takes a pause from describing these great conflicts against the faith to describe the great salvation we have through Jesus Christ, what really took place at that moment we first believed. The conclusion is that we have no need to look anywhere else for anything else to satisfy us outside of our fulfillment in Christ and neglect so great a salvation (Heb. 2:3).
