## **BEFORE the Millennium** – Revelation 20:1-3

2 Cor. 11:1-2: Rev. 19:5-9.

## **DURING the Millennium** – Revelation 20:4-6

- 1. **The People:** Jesus Christ and His saints will rule/reign 1,000 years on this earth in an apparent utopia.
  - **Saints** from the body of Christ, martyred saints from the tribulation period, and perhaps Old Testament saints will rule/reign **as kings and priests** with Jesus Christ on the throne in Jerusalem.
