

Colossians 3 introduces us to a whole new area of struggle after we receive Jesus Christ and are miraculously transformed from the inside out (Col. 2:10-14; 2 Cor. 5:17). Our main area of struggle remains to be our flesh in which we are housed. This inner struggle, our old flesh (*old man*) vs. our new Spirit (*new man*), is a \_\_\_\_\_ battle simply won with the right battle tactics <u>and</u> the desire to win. There is a coming day when our continual struggle will be over, but until then, we fight on (Rom. 7:24-25). Today we will begin by reviewing the main points we saw last week in the first four verses that give us our first key to success.

## **PUTTING OFF THE OLD MAN – Colossians 3:8-11**

**Review:** The First Key to Our Victory is a Heavenly Perspective – v. 1-7

- We have a supernatural internal transformation that only comes through the \_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus Christ in us by His Spirit who will get us to glory v. 1-3, 1:27; Php. 3:20; Eph. 2:5-6; Rom. 8:29-30.
- We must **seek** and **set our affection** on the real lasting things above, Heaven in the north (*our home*), and Jesus Christ who is returning for us with His \_\_\_\_\_\_ v. 4; Heb. 11:8-10; Gal. 4:26; 1 Tim. 6:13-14; 2 Tim. 4:1; Tit. 2:11-13; 1 Pet. 1:7-8; 1 Jn. 2:28-3:3; Rev. 22:12.
- A Christian sees these dark and often internal areas of sin (*which Heaven also sees*) and must \_\_\_\_\_ them before they potentially kill you v. 5-7; Rom. 6:11-13; Ja. 1:15; 1 Jn. 5:16-17.

	-	<u>Important</u> : <i>It is less about and more about dying</i> – Lk. 22:42; Rom. 12:1-2; 2 Cor. 4:16, 15:31; Gal. 3:3.
	-	There is no race, religious sect, nationality, or social/educational status exempt from these realities. We are all the in Christ and have <b>this same daily need</b> – v. 11; 1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:27-28.
