Jonah (God's prophet to Israel) is called by God to go to Ninevah (a massive Gentile city) to cry against it for their great wickedness. God was at his tipping point with the atrocities of Assyria. But Jonah refused to go, rebelling and running the opposite direction from God's , putting himself at great odds with the Lord (Lk. 6:46). Out of the belly of hell, Jonah comes to his senses...remembering the Lord, repenting of his sins, and is willing to return to the mission (Lk. 15:17; Hos. 6:1-3). God chooses to give Jonah and Nineveh a second chance to do what's right. Today we will consider, from Jonah, the God of second chances.
