Colossians has brought deep and insightful truths to our church in these last days concerning the fulness of Jesus Christ and our completeness in Him (v. 19, 2:9-10). We can know God's will for our lives through Jesus, our status and standing with God through Jesus, and the preeminence of Jesus Christ in our salvation, in all of creation, and in our church He purchased with His blood. Today we will see our Savior's work of reconciliation. To reconcile means to bring something back into agreement or order. Reconciliation is a mathematical term for order. Reconciliation is also a term having to do with relationships that are ______ needing restored. Today we will see that through the cross of Jesus Christ reconciliation with Him was brought to the universe He created and to each person who individually trusts in Him (v. 20-21).
