1. [Disciples are Established in the Word of God & Prayer – John 8:31; Luke 18:1-8; Col. 4:2
a	a. Key understandings of this goal:
	 God talks to us through His word, and we talk to Him through prayer. It is as simple as that! This goal is for every disciple to have a meaningful relationship with Godas Adam and Eve once did in the garden before the fall!
	- The word of God is equated to Jesus Christ Himself. The closer we get in our life to everything in that bookthe closer we are to Himself– John 1:1-5, 14-15; 1 John 5:7.
	 Prayer demonstrates our daily, moment by moment, for God – Rom. 12:12; 1 Pet. 5:6-7; Php. 4:6-7.
	 We model and teach that disciples have a diligent, daily discipline of time with God in the word of God and in prayer – Luke 4:4, 11:3; Acts 6:4; 1 Thess. 5:17.
	 KEY All disciples should come to understand that the Bible is not like any other book on Earth. There has never been, nor will there ever be, another book like the Bible. ✓ As we read the Bible, it reads us – Heb. 4:12-13 ✓ It is a mirror that gives a true of us – James 1:22-25.
b	p. Practical ways this goal is accomplished
	 There are many ways to interact with God's word on a basis (reading, writing, memorizing, meditating, journaling, etc.)Discuss them all with your disciple. ✓ Our GBC Journey lessons give examples of how to read, write, and memorize God's word.
	 KEY Don't be limited by the <i>Journey</i> lessons with what you might do to accomplish this goal! ✓ Remember, the goal is to establish us in the word of God and prayer <i>Journey</i>. ✓ What works for you, what you know works for others, and what might work for your disciple? The key is to have personal interaction with God and His word!
	 In discipleship, take time every session, apart from the lessons themselves, to discuss questions, observations, promises, etc. from God's word that each of you has seen that week. This may sometimes take up the entire time which is entirely OK! ✓ Encourage them to ask you questions they find during their reading that they don't understand. Demonstrate use of the rules of Bible study in explaining answers.
	- Pray together (start and close especially) to demonstrate your need fo God and how to pray. Ask them how/when they are praying and give suggestions.
