1. What is the difference between a birthright and a blessing (Gen. 27:36)?

- <u>Birthright</u> Any right or privilege, to which a person is entitled by _____, such as an estate descendible by law to an heir. The firstborn would typically become head of the family at the death of the father and thus would be in charge of the family and the family assets Gen. 25:29-33. God specifically sanctified (set apart) the firstborn male, both human and animal Ex. 13:2, 12-13, 34:19-20; Num. 3:13; Luke 2:23.
- <u>Blessing</u> A wish of happiness pronounced; a prayer imploring happiness or the bestowal of good upon another. It is believed that the blessing generally placed the recipient in closer favor with God.
 Typically, the blessing was received by the ______. Gen. 27:37-40.

2. <u>Can people who are in Heaven currently "look down" and see us and observe a real time view of the earth and their friends/family?</u>

- The dead remember their earthly activities Luke 16:27-28; Rev. 6:9-10.
 NOTE: Remembering earthly activities is not the same as being aware of what is ______ going on.
- The dead have no power of their own to make this happen nor does it seem that they can have any influence on or be affected by events here Ecc. 9:5-6.
- The dead can be conjured up, if God allows it, though it is clearly forbidden 1 Sam. 28; Deut. 18:10-12.
- While the examples we have in the Bible do not speak of this for ______, God can and does make known whatever He desires!

3. <u>If you have heard the gospel and never gotten saved and go through the tribulation and take the mark of the beast, but pluck out your eye or cut off your hand, will you be able to go to Heaven?</u>

- It is important to remember that the tribulation period is a different ______ than our current church age.
- If one has heard the gospel (church age) and never got saved and now is in the tribulation period, it would *seem* that this person will ______ 2 Thess. 2:1-12.
- There will be people who do get saved in the tribulation period:
 - Those martyred for Christ Rev. 6:9-11, 7:13-14, 13:15, 20:4 (**Note**: they did NOT take the mark of the beast).
 - Those who ______ to the end Matt. 24:13-22,31; Mark 13:13; Rev. 12:14.
 - **NOTE**: They must have faith in what God says and in His Son Jesus Christ (Heb. 11:1,6) and must keep His commandments Rev. 12:17, 14:12; Matt. 25.

- - There is judgment against those who have taken the mark Rev. 14:9-11, 16:2.
 - They ______ be able to cut off the mark Matt. 5:29-30, 18:8-9; Mark 9:43-47.
 - OR it may be ______ Matt. 5:29-30, 18:8-9; Mark 9:43-47. NOTE: Do a word study on "forehead".
