We are on our way from the Last Supper and first communion service (v. 1-30) across a small valley and brook to the Mount of Olives and Garden of Gethsemane (30-minute walk). This is one of Jesus most cherished places just outside the city walls (Jn. 18:1-2). Here Jesus will wrestle in his soul with God the Father about what He is about to experience. Our King is as human as we will ever see Him in our text today. This night of chaos and confusion will display the struggle between flesh and spirit, the most intense prayer you will ever see, offended disciples, deep ________ betrayal, and the mighty power of God.
