1.	Can devils haunt locations or objects? I visited a Catholic site with catacombs and felt an evil type of
	presence and eeriness. It was also as if something was following me.

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•	Haunt - To frequent; to resort to much or often, or to be much about; to visit customarily (1 Sam. 23:22, 30:31; Ezekiel 26:17). It is particularly applied to specters or apparitions.
•	There are satanic forces at work on the earth – Luke 10:17-20; Job 1:6-7; Gen. 6.
•	Some of these devils have a history of possessing and even animals – John 10:19-21; Matt. 9:32-33, 17:14-18; Luke 8:26-35; Luke 4:33-35, 41; Acts 16:16-18.  O Legion preferred to dwell in a cemetery or the wilderness.  O They dwelt in people's homes – Mark 7:25-30.  O They dwelt in the – Luke 4:33.  O They seemingly go wherever they want – Mark 9:17-22.
•	In the <u>unseen</u> world, objects are possessed or haunted per se but certainly can be manipulated by devils (Ouija board, statues crying and bleeding, cemeteries, churches, etc.) – Eph. 6:12, 2:2; Dan. 10:12-14.
	e there evil rituals and sacrifices done in specific evil locations and can Christians and non-Christians eel" that darkness? Is it the Holy Spirit, conscience, etc. bringing the feeling?
•	There were many places where satanic rituals and sacrifices occurred. Often these were done in the "high places" created by man for the worship of idols – 2 Kings 17:11, 29; 1 Kings 3:3, 12:28-31; Lev. 26:30; Num. 33:52; Jer. 32:35.
•	The Holy Spirit has 2 primary functions:  o To reprove the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment – John 16:8.  o To a believer in God's truth (John 16:13), wisdom, and discernment (1 Cor. 2:10-16).
<u>ls</u>	there a difference between the phrases "Fear the Lord" and "The Fear of the Lord"?
•	"fear the Lord" – 30x in KJV, all in OT. "fear $\underline{of}$ the Lord" – $\underline{}$ x in KJV, all but 1 in the NT (Acts 9:31).
•	"Fearing the Lord" is a response to what He is capable of – Deut. 6:2, 24; Jonah 1:9; 1 Sam. 12:24; Deut. 31:12; 2 Kings 17:25, 28, 41. The "fear of the Lord" is the complete of who God is. It is a holy reverence of God and his laws, and the desire to shun everything that offends Him and obey out of love. While there is a difference between the 2, they are also related.
•	The fear of the Lord is the <u>beginning</u> of knowledge – Pro. 1:7.
•	The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom – Pro. 9:10a. Ps. 111:10a; Pro. 15:33.
•	The fear of the Lord is – Pro. 9:10; Ps. 111:10; Job 28:28; Pro. 2:1-6.
