

## Treasury of the Psalms

**PSALM 37**

<u>Introduction</u>: Many of David's Psalms were written about the wicked when he was in great distress while being pursued by his enemies. In Psalm 37 he discusses the age-old problem of why the righteous suffer while the wicked (rich) appear to prosper (v. 12, 14, 21, 32, 35). David wrote this Psalm in his old age (v. 25). David wrote this Psalm for his fellow Israelites but perhaps to his son, Solomon, in preparation of Solomon for the throne (1 Kings 2:1-3; Pro. 23:17-18, 24:19-20).

The historical foundation for Psalm 37 is the <u>covenant</u> God made with Israel (Lev. 26; Deut. 27-30). God owned the land and promised them the <u>land</u>, <u>seed</u> (multiplied), and <u>blessings</u> in abundance. There was only one far-reaching requirement: **obedience**. David had learned how to evaluate situations in terms of the ultimate and the eternal.

1.	thyself because of evildoers. (v. 1)
	<u>Definition</u> : to burn or get heated up; to be agitated, in violent commotion, worried, anxious, provoked, irritated or angry, fearful; to utter peevish expressions.
	Case of excessive fretting:  Misunderstanding of the of adversity.  Misunderstanding of the of the cross.
	Remedy to fretting: Phi. 2:14; 4:6, 11, 13; James 1:2
	Warning if our fretting is caused by past events: If we live in the <u>past</u> , we pervert the <u>present</u> and forfeit the <u>future</u> !
2.	in the LORD, and do good. (v. 3)
	<u>Definition</u> : to be confident of something present or future; to confide in; to place confidence in; to rely on.
	The Lord can be trusted; trust your maker with all your concerns. (Job 39:11; Pro. 3:5-6; Ps 25:2, 56:4, 118:8; Is. 26:4)
3.	thyself also in the Lord; and he shall give thee the <u>desires</u> of thine heart.
	<u>Definition</u> : to please highly; to give or afford high satisfaction or joy.
	We delight in the Lord by meditating on His Word. (Ps. 1:2-3, 63:5-6, 119:99; Josh. 1:9; Ps. 119:11)
	Delight is more permanent than joy, and not dependent on sudden excitement. With God's help, we can delight in every circumstance. (James 1:2)

	Three stages of Christian development:
	<ul> <li>(spiritual infancy) 1 Jo. 2:13 "Little Children"</li> <li>(spiritual adolescence) 1 Jo. 2:14 "Young Men"</li> <li>(spiritual maturity) 1 Jo. 2:13-14 "Fathers"</li> </ul>
4.	thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass. (v. 5)
	<u>Definition</u> : to give in trust; to put into the hands or power of another (2 Tim. 2:2); to put into any place of preservation (memorizing scripture Ps. 199:11).
5.	in the LORD, and wait patiently for him. (v. 7)
	<u>Definition</u> : quiet; repose; a state of reconciliation to God (Mt 11:28-30); peace; a state free from disturbance; to be calm or composed in mind (Satan's primary target); to cease from labor (Gen. 2:2-3); to rest our cause in the truth of scripture (Ps. 40:1)
6.	from anger and forsake wrath (v. 8)
	<u>Definition</u> : to put an end to; to stop acting or speaking. (Pro. 20:3, 17:14; Eph. 4:29, 31-32)
	The opposite of anger is, resulting in: good judgment (Ps. 25:9); learning the way of God (Ps. 25:9; responding to the Gospel (Is. 61:1); having special joy (Is. 29:19); understanding Christ's nature (Mt. 11:29); radiating inward beauty (1 Pet. 3:4); power in witnessing (1 Pet 3:15).
7.	in Jesus' steps (v. 23) "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord."
	<u>Definition</u> : to pursue the course of life in which we live in obedience to God's commands. (1 Jo. 1:7; Ps. 66:9, 119:5; Gen. 17:1b, 18:20; Rom. 2:7; Ps. 23:4, 26:11)
	Walk (Col. 1:10) (Gen. 17:1), with (Is. 40:31), (Mic. 6:8), in (Eph. 5:2; 2 Jo. 6), in (Amos 3:3), in
	(Is. 40:31), (Mic. 6:8), in (Eph. 5:2; 2 Jo. 6), in (Amos 3:3), in (Col. 4:5), in the (1 Jo. 1:7), in the (Gal. 5:16).
8.	from evil and do good; and dwell forever more. (v. 27)
	<u>Definition</u> : to deviate from, forsake; to abandon; to separate from.
9.	on the LORD, and keep His ways. (v. 34) (Is. 40:31; Ps. 37:4, 52:9; Gal 5:5)
	<u>Definition</u> : to stay in expectation (of the second coming of Jesus) with an eternal perspective; to rest in patience; to be ready to serve; to attend to with submission and respect.
10.	the perfect man, and behold the upright, for the end of that man is peace. (v. 37)
	<u>Definition</u> : to notice; to take observation of. (Pro. 24:6, 11:14, 15:22)
