The Struggle is Real



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When Feelings Conquer Our Faith

Remember back in week 1 of our study we looked at God's purpose behind allowing persecution and trials in our life: to grow our faith. Faith is the key to EVERYTHING concerning our walk with God (Heb. 11:6). In preparation for spiritual growth, there must be a "tearing down" before there can be a "building up". In other words our faith must be tested. Persecution is not your enemy in your walk with God, but rather your companion: **Phil. 3:10** - *That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the <u>fellowship</u> of his <u>sufferings</u>, being made conformable unto his death;*

Over the last several weeks we have looked at the major ways in which our faith is tested and where our enemy seeks to defeat us: marriage, friend/family relationships, our job, our children. It is interesting to note that God allows persecution and trials in our life while this is also exactly where our enemy wants us – in the thick of the battle. So the key to victory, or defeat, lies in ______ we respond. What happens when we reach our breaking point?

A. Job has reached his breaking point – Job 3:1-5, 11, 24.

Depression: A sinking of the spirits; dejection; a state of sadness.

<u>Anxiety</u>: Uneasiness; unceasing restlessness in sickness. Concern or solicitude respecting some event, future or uncertain, which disturbs the mind, and keeps it in a state of painful uneasiness.

- B. Satan uses outward attacks to attack us from _____:
 - i. Job was stripped of his ______ (prosperity to poverty).
 - God blesses us with material goods, but the danger is growing to depend on them. Am I trusting in things or in God? – Ps. 20:7; Is. 31:1; Luke 12:15, 33-34; Matt. 6:31-34; 1 Tim. 6:10; Ecc. 5:10.
 - ii. He was stripped of his _
 - Family (especially children) are a special blessing from the Lord. They are a support system in times of need – Ps. 128:1-4, 127:3.
 Who am I depending on?
 - iii. He was stripped of his _____
 - Not being able to do what we once did is devastating. Our physical, mental, and emotional states are affected – 3 John 1:2; 2 Cor. 12:7-10.
 Whose power am I depending on?
 - iv. He was stripped of the ______ from his help meet.
 - Mrs. Job wound up being a discourager instead of an encourager Job 2:9.
 Who am I anchored on? Heb. 6:19.
 - v. He was stripped of his _____
 - They also were of more help to Satan than Job Ps. 41:9; Pro. 17:17, 27:6.
 Who is my best friend? Pro. 18:24; John 15:14-15; Luke 12:4.

- C. Satan knows that if he can successfully get to a person, remove their goods and comforts, remove the help and encouragement in their life, and upset and turn things "upside down" THEN he can distort their *thinking*, destroy their morale and *self-worth*, and pervert their view of the *love* of God.
 - i. Job loses his sense of worth:
 - He wished he had never been born Job 3:3.
 - He wishes for God to end his life Job 6:8-9, 11.
 NOTE: He does NOT EVER ______ taking his own life!
 - ii. Job loses his _____
 - Only complaining of how great his grief is Job 6:1-3, 7:11.
 - The fiery darts of the enemy are perceived to be the arrows of the Almighty Job 6:4; Ps. 18:14; Lam. 3:13; Ps. 38:2 (seen as punishment from God).
 - iii. Job loses his sense of God's love:
 - The man who proclaimed, "blessed be the name of the Lord" now cries in misery baffled at why God is punishing him Job 16:11-13, 9:16-17, 7:13-21.
 - iv. Other examples:
 - Samson & Delilah Judges 16.
 - John the Baptist Matt. 11:1-3.
 - ______ 1 Kings 18-19.
 - Peter Matt. 26:69-75.
