The theme of the book of Jude is to earnestly contend for the faith that was once delivered to the saints of God against apostasy at the end before the events of Revelation unfold (v. 3, 17-18). God through Jude calls them filthy dreamers against the faith (v. 8) giving harsh condemnations which will not be appreciated by most in our age of acceptance and affirmation.
