3.	How hast thou counselled him that hath no? (v. 3a, 15:8; Ps. 119:24; Ex. 18:17-24; 2 Chron. 10:8; Ez. 4:5)
4.	How hast thou plentifully declared the as it is? (v. 3b; Matt. 12:36; 2 Tim. 2:2; Lk. 12:48; Eph. 4:25; Acts 20:27; Pr. 30:5-6; Gal. 4:16)
5.	To hast thou uttered words? (v. 4a, 33:3; Col. 1:27-28, 4:6; 1 Pet. 3:15)

6. Whose _____ came from thee? (v. 4b; Rom. 8:5-9, 12-16; Gal. 5:16-18; Eph. 4:22-24; Matt. 16:23)
