# *1. Faithful Obedience Must be Settled Before the Storm Begins. (Acts 19:21; 20:22)*

- C. Unsettled Obedience Creates Vulnerability to Fear and Pressure.

- D. God's Written Word and Prior Calling Govern All Prophetic Application.

- D. True Faith Submits to God Even When the Future Is Painful.
