Let's Burn (and Perhaps Be Burned) for Jesus

Three insights for igniting and fueling Holy Spirit filled ministry

Acts 2:1-13

¹ When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. ⁵ Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven.

⁶ And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷ And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? 9 Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome,

¹¹ both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹² And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."



1. The Holy Spirit moves most when believers are together. (v. 1-4)

- There is strength in numbers.
- There is power in unity.
- There is safety in numbers.



2. Our lives will burn brightest for Jesus when our hearts are set ablaze with faith. (v. 5-12)

- When we trust Jesus, the Holy Spirit provides the will and means with which to act.
- What we do matters, but what we do will be dictated by what we believe and by how much we believe it.
- We must be ready and willing to faithfully act (not merely act faithfully).
- Let the old self burn up and let the new self in Jesus burn bright.



3. The world may try to snuff out our fire by burning us, but that will just make our light shine brighter. (v. 13)

- The world's pushback is inevitable against those who trust Jesus.
- When we burn (and perhaps get burned) for Jesus, we can count it as joy because it will just allow us to shine all the brighter.
