### The Truth Is, We Can Disagree and Still be United Ephesians 4:1-16

#### Ephesians 4:1–16 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called,

<sup>2</sup> with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love,

<sup>3</sup> eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

<sup>4</sup> There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—

<sup>5</sup> one Lord, one faith, one baptism,

#### Ephesians 4:1–16 (ESV)

<sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

<sup>7</sup> But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift.

<sup>8</sup> Therefore it says, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men."

<sup>9</sup> (In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth?

#### Ephesians 4:1–16 (ESV)

<sup>10</sup> He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.)

<sup>11</sup> And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers,

<sup>12</sup> to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,

<sup>13</sup> until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ,

#### Ephesians 4:1–16 (ESV)

<sup>14</sup> so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes.

<sup>15</sup> Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ,

<sup>16</sup> from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

1. As Christians, we must be certain of and unified in the essentials. (v. 4-6)

- There is one God, one Truth, and one way for Salvation.
- We must contend for the Faith, the Truth once and for all given to us through Scripture. (Jude)
- We must be unified as one Body of Christ in agreement on the essentials of Christianity.

2. As Christians, we must give grace in and allow room for disagreement in non-essentials. (v. 1-3)

- There are biblical issues we can disagree on but not divide over.
- There are biblical issues that we can divide for but not die over.
- There are select fundamental biblical issues that we should be willing to die for.

3. As Christians, we don't have to completely agree with other believers to cooperate with them in the Great Commission. (v. 7-16)

- Cooperation amid disagreement can lead to greater love and unity in the body of Christ. (v. 12-14)
- Love and unity amid disagreement shines the light and love of Jesus even brighter.
- If we love Jesus and the world, we'll do our best to keep our disagreements on non-essentials from getting in the way of evangelism.
