Exodus 15:11(NIBV) ¹¹ Who among the gods is like you, Lord? Who is like you—majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, working wonders?

Recently we sang "See a Victory" by Elevation Worship. The opening lyrics go as follows: The weapon may be formed, but it won't prosper/When the darkness falls, it won't prevail/'Cause the God I serve knows only how to triumph/My God will never fail/Oh, my God will never fail/I'm gonna see a victory. At this point, I thought, "There are people all over the world singing 'My God will never fail' to whatever god they serve." Yet, my thoughts continued, believing something and declaring it does not make it true. Out of all the people singing, "My God will never fail," only those singing to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and the Father of Jesus Christ will see that reality.

As I have stated before, some of the simplest truths have proven the most profound for me. There is a train of thought that states we all serve the same God, just by different names. Yet, God gave Moses His name, the name by which He is to be known. The song also contains the line, "You take what the enemy meant for evil/And You turn it for good." This is true only for those whose God is YHWH, the Father of our Savior Jesus Christ. All of creation testifies to this truth, that there is only one true God. Then, my thoughts focused on the pronoun "my." My God will never fail means that each of us have professed our faith in Him. "My God" means we have a personal relationship with Him that is vibrant and growing and maturing. That we can have such a relationship with the Creator of the Universe is only possible through Jesus Christ, Who is majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, and works miracles. Each of us must choose this day Whom we will serve and proclaim. If our God is God, then our God will never fail. That should give us the desire to proclaim that truth to everyone.
