Hebrews 4:15 (NLT) This High Priest of ours understands our weaknesses, for he faced all of the same testings we do, yet he did not sin

President Trump's pick for Secretary of Defense was General "Mad Dog" Mattis. While that choice did not please everyone in the political arena, it did resonate well with our troops. In his first address to our troops, he started by saying, "It's good to be back, and I'm grateful to serve alongside you as Secretary of Defense." What struck our troops was General Mattis' statement that he would serve alongside the troops. As I read these reports, over and over the troops were most impressed that Gen. Mattis would lead from the front and not from a desk out of harm's way. Those comments made me think of Jesus. He is our King, and He, too, leads from the front. Jesus became fully human so that He could stand with us as we battle in this world. Jesus led the way through every trial and temptation. He went first to show us the way. Even the sufferings could not and would not stop Him. We have a King who "fights" beside us. We serve a King Who is understands us and helps us.
