2 Corinthians 5:7 (NKJV) ⁷ For we walk by faith, not by sight.

We are now living in that house the Lord promised Carol, and it sits on that very spot where we looked up and saw the sky. We are able to do that because what we could not see was more real than what we could see. Walking by faith enabled us to claim a promise that defied logic. This is to be the way we walk through every day. Each day is filled with God's promises. Each day, the Lord challenges us to step out in faith. As we do so, we will see the impossible become possible.
