For Everything There Is a Season, Part 9 Time to Weep. Laugh, Mourn, and Dance October 16, 2016

I **SLIDE** Ecclesiastes 3:4

- A) Ecclesiastes 3:1, 4 (NIV) ¹ There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: ⁴ a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance,
- B) Remember, these come in opposite pairs
 - 1) Thus, weep is the opposite of laugh and vice versa
 - 2) Mourn and dance are opposites
 - 3) As with the other verses, we cannot use our definitions of these words to understand God's seasons

C) SLIDE Definitions

- 1) Weep
 - a) Bitter, intense weeping
 - b) Sinner's weeping before the LORD
 - c) Weep, wail because of grief, pain, humiliation or joy
 - d) The reason behind the weeping is the key
- 2) SLIDE Causes of weeping
 - a) Weeping in response to something sorrowful vs. weeping in response to something good
 - i) John 11:33-35 (NIV) ³³ When Jesus saw her [Mary] weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled.

 ³⁴ "Where have you laid him?" he asked. "Come and see, Lord," they replied. ³⁵ Jesus wept.
 - ii) Michael Watkins weeping when he was baptized
 - iii)Jews wept when they returned to Jerusalem
 - b) **SLIDE** Weeping that stems from true repentance vs. weeping that stems from sorrow but not repentance
 - i) Matthew 26:74-75 (NIV) 74 Then he [Peter] began to call down curses on himself and he swore to them, "I don't know

- the man!" Immediately a rooster crowed. ⁷⁵ Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken: "Before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly.
- ii) SLIDE Deuteronomy 1:42-45 (NIV) ⁴² But the LORD said to me, "Tell them, 'Do not go up and fight, because I will not be with you. You will be defeated by your enemies.'" ⁴³ So I told you, but you would not listen. You rebelled against the LORD's command and in your arrogance you marched up into the hill country. ⁴⁴ The Amorites who lived in those hills came out against you; they chased you like a swarm of bees and beat you down from Seir all the way to Hormah. ⁴⁵ You came back and wept before the LORD, but he paid no attention to your weeping and turned a deaf ear to you.
- 3) The difference
 - a) Weeping because of repentance results in salvation
 - b) Weeping because of sorrow results in excuses
 - c) We are seeing a lot of weeping in this nation but it is not from repentance
 - d) We need to pray that a time of weeping because of repentance sweep this nation
- D) SLIDE Time to laugh
 - 1) Like the verb for "weep," this verb also has a positive and negative meaning
 - 2) Laugh
 - a) To rejoice; a strong expression of joy and celebration
 - b) To ridicule or mock another
 - c) In one instance I am laughing with you; in the other I am laughing at you
 - 3) SLIDE True joy and laughter can only be found in Jesus Christ
 - a) Think of the birth of a child
 - b) Being married to your true soul mate
 - c) Salvation and Baptism

- d) Fellowship picnic
- e) This laughter comes from the inside and not the outside
- f) We do not laugh at someone else; we laugh because of the joy in our hearts
- 4) SLIDE On the other hand, there is a season ...
 - a) when laughter stems from ridiculing or mocking others
 - b) Luke 22:63 (NIV) The men who were guarding Jesus began mocking and beating him.
 - c) when laughter stems from coarse, vulgar words or situations
 - d) Larry Lessing
 - i) American Academic, attorney, political activist, Stanford University professor and one-time advisor to Pres. Obama
 - ii) Includes in his lecture a video of a 'gay' Jesus Christ sashaying nearly naked down a city street to the tune of "I Will Survive," only to get run over by a bus.
- 5) SLIDE I believe we are in this season of ungodly laughter
 - a) Laughter does not stem from joy but from vulgarity
 - b) It does not stem from the happiness in our lives but from the ridiculing of others, including Jesus Christ
 - c) Laughter has become an idol as we sacrifice other people's dignity for our amusement
 - d) Compare Andy Griffith to the comedy shows of today
 - e) Compare Johnny Carson to Comedy Central
 - f) The news is filled with people laughing at Trump and at Clinton
 - g) Such laughter is a sign of the state of our hearts
- 6) **SLIDE** Which should cause us to mourn over the condition of this nation
 - a) Mourn means to lament Passionate expression of grief or sorrow
 - b) Think of lamentations
- 7) Yet, we do not lose faith because there is also a time to dance
 - a) Mourn and dance do not seem to be opposites
 - b) However, dance in this context means to leap and skip

- c) This dancing is a response to God's presence, redemption, grace, mercy, and restoration
- d) SLIDE Malachi 4:2 (CJB) ² But to you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings; and you will break out leaping, like calves released from the stall.
- e) Video of calf
- f) SLIDE 1 Chronicles 15:29 (NIV) ²⁹ As the ark of the covenant of the LORD was entering the City of David, Michal daughter of Saul watched from a window. And when she saw King David dancing and celebrating, she despised him in her heart.
- E) We may be in a season of weeping and mourning over the condition of this nation, but that season will pass
 - 1) We will probably mourn for a while longer
 - 2) But the season to dance will follow
 - 3) David mourned the loss of the Ark of the Covenant
 - 4) When he danced, he danced from the heart
 - 5) That is what we have to look forward to.
- F) Rededication
 - 1) Time to weep and a time to laugh
 - 2) Time of weeping from repentance is followed by a time of laughing and rejoicing
