# Constant Use and Balanced November 25, 2018

- I **SLIDE** Pruning is a sign of Jesus' love and presence
  - A) Hebrews 5:14-6:1 (NIV) <sup>14</sup> But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil. <sup>1</sup> Therefore let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity.
  - B) **SLIDE** Definitions
    - 1) Constant use: habit; practice or exercise
    - 2) Train: exercise, as an athlete; train in godliness; exercise by training and discipline
    - 3) Distinguish: discern; judge (not people but good and evil);
    - 4) Good and Evil: in a moral sense; as determined by God's word;
    - 5) **Proverbs 15:3 (NIV)** <sup>3</sup> The eyes of the LORD are everywhere, keeping watch on the wicked and the good.
  - C) SLIDE Constant Use
    - 1) Mature has nothing to do with age
    - 2) Person can be 80 and still exist on milk
    - 3) Maturity comes from the constant use of God's word
    - 4) Through the exercise, training, and disciplined use of God's word, we mature in our faith
    - 5) We are saved by the word and not by works
    - 6) We are cleansed by the power of the word
    - 7) However, we grow by the constant use of that word
    - 8) When we put the Word into practice, we will discover that we need to be pruned, refined
    - 9) Through constant use, our faith grows
    - 10) However, if all we do is talk about the word, then we do not have to be pruned because we will change the word to fit our talk
    - 11) But, when we commit to living that word, then we are constantly being refined because Jesus loves us and wants us to produce much fruit

## D) Teaching

- 1) Took four years of college
- 2) Last semester, I took methods class and did my student teaching
- 3) Got my degree
- 4) So, according to the law, I was a qualified teacher
- 5) However, when I walked into my classroom for the first time, I was put to the test
- 6) For the first time, I was responsible
- 7) For the first time, I had to put into practice what I had learned
- 8) Over time, I learned what was good and what was not
- 9) Over time, I learned to teach
- 10) In other words, I was not longer a teacher because a piece of paper said I was
- 11) I was a teacher by the constant use of what I had learned and by the constant use of God's word
- 12) After constant practice, I no longer had to read about how to teach
- 13) Instead, out of habit, I knew how to teach, how to apply what I had learned, and what did not work

#### E) SLIDE Mature

- 1) Interestingly, those who are called *the mature* are mature because they have disciplined themselves:
- 2) Spiritually mature Christians constantly examine themselves (NOT OTHERS), turn away from sin, and learn what actions, thoughts, and attitudes will please God.
- 3) These people "have trained themselves" to distinguish good from evil..
- 4) In order to grow from infancy to maturity, we must learn discernment.
- 5) We must train our consciences, senses, and minds to distinguish good from evil from God's view and not the world's

6) We must incorporate from the word of God principles of right thinking and right action whereby we can correctly judge moral situations that occur.

### F) SLIDE Good from evil

- 1) This is not a natural trait
- 2) As a matter of fact, it is just the opposite
- 3) Just as I had to practice and train to become an effective teacher, we are to use, practice God's word until it becomes natural
- 4) Can we recognize temptation before it traps us?
- 5) Can we recognize what not to say AND then not say it?
- 6) Can we tell the difference between a correct use of Scripture and a mistaken one?
- 7) SLIDE Can we identify false doctrines?
- 8) Can we identify legalism as opposed to grace?
- 9) Can we welcome God's pruning with thanks?
- 10) Can we give reasons for our beliefs and faith in Jesus?
- 11) Can we avoid arguments that divide us?
- 12) Do we ask what we can do for the church instead of what the church can do for us?
- 13) Do we accept spiritual correction, or do we get upset and walk away?
- G) Constant use is how we mature

#### II Balanced

- A) Wendy
  - 1) She said she was going to have to work to keep things balanced
  - 2) SLIDE That word jumped out at me: BALANCED
  - 3) We need to have a balanced life if we are going to put His word into constant use
  - 4) If we do not, then we will never have time to do what He wants us to do
  - 5) All of us have many demands on our time

- 6) We all have things we want to do
- 7) Often, these things can take precedent over our spiritual walk
- 8) Maintaining a balanced life means we leave room for the constant use of God's word
- 9) Johnny Carson
  - a) Balancing act
  - b) Balancing spinning plates on slender rods
  - c) SLIDE Ran from one to the other to keep one from falling
  - d) SLIDE
  - e) This often resembles our lives
  - f) We run from one thing to another to keep it spinning
  - g) Somewhere in the midst of all of this, we have a plate called "Church"
- 10) This is not the Balanced the Lord wants
- 11) He wants to establish firmly all aspects of our lives and wants us to trust Him to keep the plates spinning
- 12) When He balances our lives, we will have peace, times to relax, and times to serve
