About the same time, Jazmin, also a recent graduate, was assigned to the same precinct. The two women became locker neighbors and discovered that they had the same last name: Molina. This unique fact brought them together, and they became friends. One day, Yadarquiris, the older of the two, remembered that a long time ago, her mother told her she had a sister somewhere. She jokingly told Jazmin, "It would be funny if were family." Jazmin laughed and said, "Maybe, because I don't know my father's side of the family." As they continued talking, they realized that they were sisters! Yadarquiris said the sisters do not believe in coincidence but in God's will to make their paths cross.

Often when we read stories like that of Joseph, we see them only as ancient stories. God is working in our lives so that our paths cross the paths of those who are to be part of our lives. Many people will read about those sisters and attribute their meeting to luck or coincidence. When they do, they will view it as an isolated event that has nothing to do with them. However, as the sisters said, "There are no coincidences; there is only God." Therefore, their story is part of our story because all stories are part of God's story.
