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GREAT JOY OVERCOMES GREAT PAIN



Main takeaway- Jesus, the source of our greatest joy, has overcome sin, the source of our greatest pain.

Zecheriah and Elizabeth experienced great pain. (Luke 1:6-7)

- They experienced the great pain of realizing they couldn't have children.
- In the midst of this pain, they sought the Lord.
- They were righteous in the sight of God, not because of their good deeds, but because they continued to seek God in the midst of hardship.

Zecheriah doubted, Elizabeth believed. (Luke 1:18, 25)

- Zecheriah questioned Gabriel. "How can I be sure of this?"
- Elizabeth received the news with faith. "The Lord has done this for me."
- God revealed his perfect plan to Zecheriah and Elizabeth in his perfect timing.

Mary and Elizabeth's encounter (Luke 1:30-47)

- Mary receives the news from Gabriel with faith. "May your word to me be fulfilled."
- When Elizabeth and Mary draw near to each other, Élizabeth's baby leaps for joy.
- The presence of Jesus in Mary's womb was causing those nearby to experience joy.
- Elizabeth joyfully blesses Mary (verses 42-45)
- Mary joyfully praises God (verses 46-47)

Zecheriah's response (Luke 1:67-79)

- Zecheriah responds with a song of joyful praise
- John the Baptist is born, but Zecheriah praises God for the news of Jesus first. (verses 68-69)
- John the Baptist would prepare the way for Jesus (verses 76-77)

The Joy of the Lord is our strength (Nehemiah 8)

- People of Israel heard God's Word and began to weep because they felt the weight of their sin.
- Nehemiah tells them not to be sad, for the joy of the Lord is their strength.
- The joy of the Lord is found in reading and studying God's Word.
- The joy of the Lord is not based on our emotions. It's based on the truth of who God is.
- The joy of the Lord is our strength for life.
- The joy of the Lord overcomes all of our pain and suffering.

- We are called to receive and share the joy of the Lord. Who will you share this joyful news with this Christmas season?
