PEACE IN THE PAIN

Scripture Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, <u>we have peace with God</u> through our Lord Jesus Christ

- Romans 5:1

When "we also glory in our sufferings it means that as Christians we do not deny the reality of our sufferings nor are we overcome by them. (Romans 5:3)

Good coming from suffering (Romans 5:3-4)

- Call to perseverance
- Refining of our character

- Biblical hope

- People who continually quit or try to cut corners rob themselves and those around them of encounters will God's grace and opportunities for growth. The most important things to help us endure is that God promises to be with us (Isaiah 43:2)

Romans 5 gives us clear pictures of who we were before relationship with Jesus and who we are becoming in our walk with him:

- V6 Powerless → Holy Spirit empowered
- V6 Ungodly → Godly
- V8 Sinners → Holy Saints
- V10 Enemies → Friends and Family of God

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

God promises the believer "peace in the pain". In reading Romans 5:3-4:

- How is God refining your character?
- Where are you placing your hope?
