

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IN THE HANDS OF GOD

- Yield what you do have

There was not a specific individual with a need but there was a huge gathering of people, and they all had the same need at the same time. Jesus sees the multitude and has compassion for them. (John 6:5, Mark 6:34)

There is No problem that we will ever encounter that will take the Lord by surprise or causes Him to wonder. (John 6:6)

Our faith in God is not real unless it is tested! Tests or trials facilitates the growth of our faith. (James 1:2-3, 1 Peter 1:6-7)

What we see in Andrew's life is that he was a very perceptive person spiritually as he was always bringing other people to Jesus. He was a connector. We should be known as Christians; a person who knows the Lord. (John 1:40-42, John 12:20-22, John 6:8-9)

- Doing a lot with a little

Jesus broke the five loaves and the two fish to make it sufficient for everyone's need. (Mark 6:41, Philippians 4:19)

Don't look down on small beginnings. We see the Lord giving thanks to God for the five loaves and the two fish. (John 6:11)

- When a little becomes A lot

Notice that Jesus' tells his disciples to gather up the fragments that nothing be wasted. This is a fundamental principle of abundance: not wasting what we have and being good stewards. (John 6:12-13)
