I AM THE VINE

In the O.T. the vine represented the covenant people of God, planted and tended by him so that Israel would produce fruit. Generally when Israel is depicted as a vine or vineyard, the nation is being chastised for not bearing fruit as God expects. Where Israel failed Jesus stepped in and succeeded! (Is. 5:3–5)

JOHN 15:1-17 10-1 AM THE TRUE VINE, AND MY FATHER IS THE HUSBANDHAN, EVERY BRANCH IN ME THAT BEARETH 1 FRUIT ME Y THE VINE & THE BRANCHES 5)

- Scripture Reading: John 15:1-8

Spiritual growth and the fruit of the Spirit is a byproduct of being connected to God. The life of Jesus is flowing through you as you are connected to him or there is no fruit because you are simply not connected to Jesus

How can one tell if they are being cut off or pruned?

- If you're being cut off, you won't care about God's word nor will you seriously live it out. God might be handing you over the the fleshly desires of your heart (Romans 1:24-25)
- If you're being pruned it means that God will allow you to go through seasons of difficulty to become less dependent on the self and more dependent on Him. It does not mean you did anything wrong (Romans 5:3-5; James 1:2-4)
 - Believers should expect to get pruned

God calls us to "remain" 11x in John 15:4-10

Sometimes people are confused as to why they haven't felt God, heard from God, encountered the Lord - wherein the problem lies in the fact that they haven't sought him, talked to him, submitted their life to him - they are not connected to him nor have they remained in him.

"...apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5)

Apple Tree analogy

When we try to "manage our sin" we try to will ourselves to love and kindness. Because this is in our own power it's unsustainable and will not truly shape our hearts to Christ-likeness which is ultimately done by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Religion is spelled "DO" whereas Christianity is all about what Jesus has "DONE". Our starting spot of accepting and celebrating the death and resurrection of Jesus!

Clear indicators that you're connected to God and have a life producing fruit of the Spirit:

- You're obedient to the scriptures (John 15:10,15)
- Your love for God and others is increasing (Matthew 22:37-40)

We must reflect and examine our inner life. What are our underlying motives and desires? See the picture of an iceberg

Characteristics of leaders who thrived over the long haul

- 1. They had a deeper inner life with God
- 2. They were humble and self-reflective leaders
- 3. They had a mentor or friend who held them accountable
 - Study by Archibald Hart, Fuller Theological Seminary

Time of Reflection

- -Think about the two apple trees. How is God calling you to practically "remain in him" throughout your day?
- As we do this the Spirit will cultivate the fruit of the Spirit inside you. Make a plan to implement brief moments of: silence, solitude, prayer and scripture reflection at different points in your day.
