## **QUESTIONS FOR GROWTH**

\*Describe the most unusual or unexpected situation in which you had a conversation about Jesus. Who initiated the conversation? Why was it so unexpected?



Read Acts 8:26-40

1. From the text itself, what did you hear/learn that you did not know before this weekend?

- 2. How would you describe Philip's response to the Spirit's instructions? What does this tell us about Philip? How is this situation similar to one could you run into in your everyday life?
- 3. What specific things do we learn about the Ethiopian man in verses 27-28? How did Philip take advantage of this unexpected situation?

4. In his message, Pastor Brian said, "God uses people to save people." How is this statement true and what should it communicate to us?

5. What might have happened if Philip was unprepared to talk about Scripture or unfamiliar with the Isaiah prophecy? What are some specific ways that we can prepare ourselves for encounters such as this? What can we do when we don't have all the answers?

6. What did the man's question in verse 36 convey? How does this reflect a changed heart? What does his example teach us about the importance of next steps such as baptism in the believer's life?

7. Read Romans 10:14–17. Why is evangelism and sending missionaries important in fulfilling the Great Commission?
