*Read Acts 6:8-8:3*

1. From the text itself, what did you hear/learn that you did not know before this weekend?
2. Reading 2 Corinthians 4:8-9, what can we glean from the experiences of Paul and the other apostles? How does Paul's optimism impact you or change your perspective on trying times?
3. According to Acts 6:10, the Jews could not dispute Stephen's words about Christ. Why do you believe that was the case, and how does this line up with Luke 21:15?
4. Pastor Brian said, "Stephen used the Word of God, which they knew, to introduce them to the Word of God that they did not know." Read Stephen's actual sermon (Acts 7:2-50). What stood out to you? Why? What does this sermon tell you about Stephen's knowledge of the Old Testament?
5. What are some similarities between Jesus' death and Stephen's death? What does the way Stephen died show you about what he believed?
6. Considering the life and testimony of Stephen, what do you believe had the greatest impact on Saul (who is also known as Paul)?
7. Read Acts 1:8. What do you take away from the fact that the Gospel is still "only" in Jerusalem in Acts 6:7? How does this compare with Acts 8:3? What made the difference?
