# **Adam**

Genesis 2:15-17 VOICE

The Eternal God placed the newly made man in the garden of Eden in order to work the ground and care for it. He made certain demands of the man regarding life in the garden.

God: Eat freely from any and all trees in the garden; I only require that you abstain from eating the fruit of one tree—the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Beware: the day you eat the fruit of this tree, you will certainly die.

# Noah

#### **Genesis 6:5-6 HCSB**

[5] When the Lord saw that man's wickedness was widespread on the earth and that every scheme his mind thought of was nothing but evil all the time, [6] the Lord regretted that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart.

# **Genesis 6:8 MSG**

[8] But Noah was different. God liked what he saw in Noah.

Question who do you think knows more about what's inside you? You or God?

# **Genesis 6:9 NKJV**

[9] This is the genealogy of Noah. Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God.

# **Genesis 6:9 AMPC**

[9] This is the history of the generations of Noah. Noah was a just and righteous man, blameless in his [evil] generation; Noah walked [in habitual fellowship] with God.

#### **Genesis 6:9 NMV**

[9] These [are] the generations of Noach (Rest, Consolation): Noach (Rest, Consolation) was a just man [and] perfect in his generations, and Noach (Rest, Consolation) walked with God-Elōhīm [The Living Word - The Many Powered].

#### **Genesis 6:22 AMPC**

[22] Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him.

# **Genesis 7:1 NLT**

[1] When everything was ready, the Lord said to Noah, "Go into the boat with all your family, for among all the people of the earth, I can see that you alone are righteous.

# **Genesis 7:5 NLT**

[5] So Noah did everything as the Lord commanded him.

#### Genesis 7:16 NLT

[16] A male and female of each kind entered, just as God had commanded Noah. Then the Lord closed the door behind them.

# 1 Corinthians 15:45 NLT

[45] The Scriptures tell us, "The first man, Adam, became a living person." But the last Adam—that is, Christ—is a life-giving Spirit.

# Hebrews 8:6-10 NLT

[6] But now Jesus, our High Priest, has been given a ministry that is far superior to the old priesthood, for he is the one who mediates for us a far better covenant with God, based on better promises. [7] If the first covenant had been faultless, there would have been no need for a second covenant to replace it. [8] But when God found fault with the people, he said: "The day is coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and Judah. [9] This covenant will not be like the one I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand and led them out of the land of Egypt. They did not remain faithful to my covenant, so I turned my back on them, says the Lord. [10] But this is the new covenant I will make with the people of Israel on that day, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their minds, and I will write them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.

# Hebrews 12:18-25 NLT

[18] You have not come to a physical mountain, to a place of flaming fire, darkness, gloom, and whirlwind, as the Israelites did at Mount Sinai. [19] For they heard an awesome trumpet blast and a voice so terrible that they begged God to stop speaking. [20] They staggered back under God's command: "If even an animal touches the mountain, it must be stoned to death." [21] Moses himself was so frightened at the sight that he said, "I am terrified and trembling." [22] No, you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to countless thousands of angels in a joyful gathering. [23] You have come to the assembly of God's firstborn children, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God himself, who is the judge over all things. You have come to the spirits of the righteous ones in heaven who have now been made perfect. [24] You have come to Jesus, the one who mediates the new covenant between God and people, and to the sprinkled blood, which speaks of forgiveness instead of crying out for vengeance like the blood of Abel. [25] Be careful that you do not refuse to listen to the One who is speaking. For if the people of Israel did not escape when they refused to listen to Moses, the earthly messenger, we will certainly not escape if we reject the One who speaks to us from heaven!
