Second Reading - 1 John 4:1-21

¹Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. 2 By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you heard was coming and now is in the world already. 4 Little children, you are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. ⁵ They are from the world; therefore they speak from the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶ We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us; whoever is not from God does not listen to us. By this we know the Spirit of truth and the spirit of error. ⁷ Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. 9 In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. 10 In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 11 Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us. 13 By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. 14 And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. 15 Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. 16 So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. ¹⁷ By this is love perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as he is so also are we in this world. 18 There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. 19 We love because he first loved us. 20 If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. 21 And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth; I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Father, thank You for Your great love for us and for hearing Your people when we pray. Please help every member of Your Church family to truly know and humbly serve You:

That Your Name may be known and glorified by all people.

Holy Communion

The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

On the night He was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when He had given thanks to You, He broke it, and gave it to His disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper He took the cup of wine; and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer You these gifts. Sanctify them by Your Holy Spirit to be for Your people the Body and Blood of Your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life we have through faith in Him.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve You in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all Your saints into the joy of Your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through Your Son Jesus Christ: By Him, and with Him, and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is Yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen**.

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

No wine will be offered at this time.

Dear Resurrection Family and Friends,

Last week, the CDC released new recommendations regarding mask wearing for those who have been vaccinated, and the governor and our county executive clarified Maryland policies on Thursday and Friday. Keeping these new guidelines in mind, our regathering team met and presented a proposal to the vestry, and the vestry has approved these recommendations.

Before I present the next steps, it is important to reiterate the values that have guided our decision-making process. Over the last year, our desire has been to balance safety, pastoral care, and the best scientific and medical expertise available. Our shared values include honoring Christ in how we speak to one another; following Christ's example of putting the interests of others ahead of our own; exercising discretion as opposed to being first; practicing patience while being proactive in moving forward; and being willing to compromise in the short-term to make sure we stick together as a church in the long-term. I am proud of our vestry, staff, and lay leaders who have implemented our regathering plan. While not everyone has agreed with the pace and policies, I have been very grateful for the overall humility and love that our congregation has displayed toward one another in what has been a difficult season for all.

In light of these shared values, the vestry and I are seeking to move forward with our regathering process. As we consider incorporating the new government guidelines, we are also striving to balance the desires of vaccinated congregants who are comfortable without masking with those congregants who are uncomfortable not wearing masks or who are uncomfortable being in the presence of others not wearing masks.

These next steps will be implemented for five weeks and then will be reevaluated on June 22 at our next vestry meeting:

Updated Building Use Regathering Policy

- If vaccinated, anyone entering the building has the option to remove their mask while remaining conscious of social distancing.
- Unvaccinated people are expected to remain masked and maintain social distance.
- Children below the age of 5 are not required to wear a mask in the building, except in ResKids classrooms.
- All vaccinated people who enter the building without a mask are asked to have a posture of humility and be willing to wear a mask if those they are with ask them to wear one.

Updated Outdoor Regathering Policy

- Masks are optional for everyone outdoors while remaining conscious of social distance.
- All who are not wearing a mask outside are asked to have a posture of humility and be willing to wear a mask if those they are with ask them to wear one.

Beginning Sunday, May 23, 2021: Worship Services

9:00am service: Masks will be required for all participants over the age of 5.

- Online registration will continue on our website at least through June 13 and will remain open until the service begins.
- There will be singing throughout the service.
- Everyone will seat themselves with every other pew marked off with ribbons.

The 11:15am service will be changed to 11:00am.

11:00am service: Masks will be optional for those who have been vaccinated.

- The balcony will be a mask-only zone.
- Online registration will continue on our website at least through June 13 and will remain open until the service begins.
- There will be singing throughout service.
- Everyone will seat themselves with every other pew marked off with ribbons.
- Unvaccinated children over age of 5 must be masked.

Additional Regathering Policies

- Bulletins will be available for pick up on tables in the Commons.
- Communion will be taken at the rail instead of the seat/pew beginning May 30.
- Wine will be served at communion via intinction (bread dipped in wine) beginning May 30.
- Processional and recessional with limited number of acolytes will begin on May 30.
- Fellowship may be offered beginning on June 13.
- June 13 is an all-parish outdoor service at 10:00am.

Please continue to pray for our church family as we enter this new regathering season. We will continue to monitor the status of Covid rates in our local area, abide by any changes in the law, and will reassess our policies leading up to next month's vestry meeting on June 22. As we navigate the guidelines and comfort levels of our congregation, we are trusting that the Lord will continue to use this season to grow us and teach us how to love and serve Him and one another.
