A General Requirement

One whose outward, observable conduct is without blame or accusation.

Areas of Examination

- 1. An elder's expression of his sexuality
- Elders must be morally accountable for their sexuality.
- 2. An elder's judgment
 - Sober-minded alert
 - Self-controlled disciplined judgment
 - Respectable well-ordered or trustworthy
- 3. The fulfillment of an elder's two primary responsibilities
 - Hospitable "an open heart with everyone"
 - Able to teach able to "confront, correct & comfort with God's word."
- 4. The elder's temperament and disposition
 - His drinking habits he should be an example of self-mastery
 - His interaction with others gracious, kind and considerate of their feelings
 - His attitude toward money content with and grateful for what God has given him
- 5. The elder's home life
 - An elder has a proven history of nurturing and directing those under his care in his home.
- 6. An elder's spiritual maturity
 - His spiritual age
 - His reputation outside of the church
