SCRIPTURE READING

Read Aloud & Meditate on God's Word: Colossians 3:23-24

EXPLORE THE TEXT

- 1. Read Psalm 86:11 (NIV). What is a divided heart? What steps are required to ensure your heart remains united with and by God?
- 2. "Every occupation has its own honor before God. Ordinary work is a divine vocation or calling. In our daily work no matter how important or mundane, we serve God by serving the neighbor, and we also participate in God's on-going providence for the human race" (Martin Luther). Discuss this quotation. How might Luther's words influence your approach to God's calling on your life?
- 3. Define "vocation." What are your vocations? In what labors do you find joy and choose to invest your whole heart?
- 4. Read Matthew 5:13-16. Describe the importance of being Jesus' salt and light. In what ways could you be saltier and brighter for him?
- 5. Read Proverbs 3:5-6. How does this proverb connect to Colossians 3:23-24?
- 6. Rewrite Colossians 3:23-24 as your personal mission statement to and for God.
