PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION 15 MINUTES

MADE TO CONNECT

an activity that invites kids to share with others and build on their understanding



Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Pray for those who might visit your group for the first time. Thank God for the wise people in your life who have led you to make wise choices and follow Jesus. Ask God to help the kids in your group discover that who they spend time with impacts their wisdom and the choices they make.

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

Much Needed Advice

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BASIC TRUTH

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1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, drawing paper, coloring materials, and dry-erase board and dry-erase marker (or poster board and washable marker)

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive to group.
- Encourage kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- As kids arrive, ask them to share if they could be an underwater sea creature for a day, which one they would choose to become, and why.
- When enough kids have arrived, give each one a piece of drawing paper.
- Set out the coloring materials.
- Using a dry-erase board and dry-erase marker (or poster board and washable marker), show kids how to draw two or three large circles on their paper.
- Instruct the kids to copy those circles on their paper.
- Encourage the kids to fill in those circles by writing the names of different groups of people (one category per circle).
- · Some ideas for each category could be:
 - names of the kids from a team they're on
 - names of school friends
 - names of online gamer friends
 - names of neighborhood friends
 - names of church friends, etc.
- Help younger kids with writing names, as needed.
- Invite kids to share their circle categories with the group.
- · Talk about what these groups have in common, and what makes them different.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Drawing paper, and crayons or markers

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to think about people they know who are wise.
- If further prompting is needed, ask:
- "Who helps you when you don't know what to do?"
- "Who gives good advice about getting along with friends?"
- "Who have you seen make choices that help keep people safe?"
- Give each kid a piece of paper.
- Set out the markers or crayons.
- Instruct the kids to draw a picture of the person they're thinking of who is wise.
- As kids are working, ask them to share stories of when they noticed their person making a wise choice.
- When everyone is finished, invite them to share with the group who they drew and why.
- · Collect their drawings.
- Set the drawings out face down on one side of your group space.
- Gather the kids on the other side of your group space.
- When you say, "Go," direct each kid one at a time to walk to the other side of the group space and choose one paper at random to flip over.
 - If the kid happens to flip over their paper, direct them to go back to the other side of your group space.
 - If the kid flips over someone else's paper, give them time to figure out who
 it belongs to and hand it to them.
- Once everyone has their original paper, invite them to return back to the other side of the group space.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"We have a lot of people around us who say a LOT of stuff, but how do we know who to trust with the BIG stuff? When you have a decision to make or need important advice, who do you talk to? [Transition] Today, we're going to hear about what happened when someone had a big decision to make and asked the wrong people for help."

1. LOUD TALKERS

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Loud Talkers Script" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

• Explain that you will review today's Bible story, and each time you mention certain people from the story, you'll pause

for kids to respond with the responses below.

- Review the following people from the story, teach the kids their responsive role, and practice them a few times together.
 - Solomon: Direct kids to say, "All hail the king!"
 - Rehoboam: Direct kids to say, "I don't know?"
 - Wise Advisors: Direct kids to say, "Make the wise choice!"
 - Friends: Direct kids to say, "Brooooooo!" ("Bro," drawn out)
 - Israelites: Direct kids to make angry crowd noise.
- Once kids understand their responsive roles, read the "Loud Talkers Script"
 Activity Page with enthusiasm—pausing slightly each time kids need to
 contribute a character response (which is in bold).

WHAT YOU SAY:

"When Rehoboam chose to listen to the foolish words of his friends rather than the wise words of his experienced advisors, it led to disaster. Why do you think Rehoboam listened to his friends instead of to the wise advisors? (*Invite responses*.)

"Who are some of the wise advisors in your life? (Invite responses.) Think about people in your life who might give you foolish advice if you ask. When you are deciding how to act at different times, who are you most likely to listen to? Older people like teachers, coaches, and parents? Or your friends? Why? (Invite responses.)

"When it comes to making wise choices, you should **hang out with wise people.** God wants us to become more like Jesus in everything we do—including our choices."

*2. SHARKS AND SEA TURTLES [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Direct the kids to form a large, standing circle.
- Teach the kids dive hand signs for shark and sea turtle:
- Shark: Put one hand on the top of your head, sticking straight up, palm facing the side, like a shark fin
- Sea Turtle: Place one open hand on top of the other and rotate both thumbs to look like a turtle
- Instruct the kids to "swim" in place with their arms until you make the sign for either shark or turtle.
- Make a sign for "shark" or "sea turtle."
- Direct the kids to copy the sign you make.
- Inform the last kid to make the sign to be out.
- Play several rounds as time allows—have older kids take turns to be the dive leader, if desired.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"If you're diving in the ocean, what's the biggest difference between a shark and a sea turtle? (*Invite responses—sharks are dangerous*.) You probably won't come across a shark on the playground or in your backyard, but sometimes the choices we make are like sharks and sea turtles—choices that could be dangerous and choices that are safe.

"You want people in your life who can help you tell the difference between those kind of choices. You don't want a friend who is always encouraging you to make 'shark' choices. You want friends to share cool experiences and make 'sea turtle' choices. You want to hang out with wise people.

"We can grow in wisdom by spending time with people who follow Jesus and make good choices. Ask your parents or other wise adults for advice and help. Notice which of your friends and classmates make wise choices. It's important to be friendly and kind to everyone, but you want to spend the MOST time with people who you know are wise."

[Make It Personal] (Share about wise friends you've had as a kid or as an adult—what makes you think they are wise? What kind of choices do they make, or advice do they give? If you have an age-appropriate story to share about a 'shark' type of friend, you can let kids know that sometimes shark friends seem cool, but following their advice leads to problems.)

- Instruct that team with the second part of the verse to "swim" to the next group, make the sign they were shown, and add their own sign as well.
- Direct the teams to continue in this way until the verse is completed.
- By the last group, there should be signs for each part of the verse.
- Bring everyone together.
- Make the dive signs for the whole verse as you say the verse together.

"You guys came up with some really cool signs! And now we know our whole verse! Our verse reminds us that God will give wisdom to anyone who asks. God wants us to grow in wisdom and become more like Jesus. The more we hang out with wise people, the more we become like Jesus.

"If you don't have wise friends in your life, what should you do? (Invite responses, like: ask God to bring you wise friends, look for people making wise choices and become friends, ask wise adults for advice, etc.) If you do have wise friends in your life, what should you do? (Invite responses, like: spend more time with them, talk about important stuff together, pray with them, thank God for them, etc.)

4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Index cards, construction paper, or blank greeting cards; coloring materials; and pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Set out the supplies.
- Invite kids to make a thank-you card for someone in their life who has given them wisdom or good advice—a friend, classmate, teacher, teammate, coach, grandparent, or leader.
- · When everyone is finished, close in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Dear God, thank You for these friends and leaders in our lives. Thanks for giving us good opportunities to **hang out with wise people.** Please help us listen to those around us who are giving good advice and who point us to You when we need wisdom. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, ask kids to demonstrate the shark and sea turtle signs to their families. Explain that those signs show wise and dangerous choices. Encourage families to use those signs as reminders when they need to make the wise choice.
