- 1. If someone were to ask you, "what is the church?" what would you say?

- 5. How does the Body of Christ analogy from scripture (1 Corinthians 12) shed light on how a church should operate?
- 6. In our sinful human world, divisions are a regular occurrence. What things would have to happen for church discipline to be enacted? What is your role is keeping the church unified?
- 7. Is there something that your local church does that you guestion? Who can you ask about that?
- 8. The Holy Spirit has specific things for you as a missionary and a part of the local church. What do you believe it is? What activities should you be about week to week?
