

## 5-Day Devotional: Renewing Your Vision

### Day 1: The Goodness of God in Our Stories

Reading: Psalm 107:1-9

Devotional: "Some of y'all sitting in this room right now, there is absolutely no reason for you to be alive today other than the goodness of God." These words remind us that our survival isn't about our merit—it's about His mercy. When you look back at your story, can you see the fingerprints of God's faithfulness? Even through X-rated chapters we'd rather forget, He remained good. The psalmist calls us to "give thanks to the Lord, for He is good." Today, inventory your life. Where has God rescued you from destruction? Where has He satisfied your thirsty soul? Your testimony isn't about your goodness—it's a declaration of His. Let gratitude reshape how you see your past and fuel your faith for the future.

Reflection Question: What part of your story reveals God's goodness most clearly?

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### Day 2: Living Sacrifice—The Reasonable Response

Reading: Romans 12:1-2

Devotional: Paul calls presenting our bodies as living sacrifices "reasonable service." Think about that—giving God everything isn't extreme; it's logical. We respond frantically to weather forecasts, yet casually approach eternal realities. What if we prepared for Christ's return with the same urgency we show for snowstorms? The transformation Paul describes begins in our minds. We can't change our bodies without first changing our thinking. Every sin starts as a thought before becoming action. Renewal isn't a one-time event but a daily re-upping of our commitment. Step into the offering plate today. Not with perfection, but with holy surrender—made acceptable not by your efforts but by Jesus' blood. This isn't about becoming weird; it's about becoming different, set apart for God's purposes.

Reflection Question: What area of your thinking needs transformation today?

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### Day 3: Breaking the Addiction to Temporary Fixes

Reading: John 4:7-14

Devotional: We're all addicts—to sin, to approval, to control, to comfort. We run to temporary fixes that satisfy for five minutes but leave us empty again. Jesus told the woman at the well about living water that quenches thirst permanently. What's your fix? Career success? Financial security? Critical thoughts about others? Even respectable addictions become idols when they replace God. The difference between works and grace illustrates this perfectly: works bring temporary happiness dependent on performance; grace brings permanent peace rooted in Christ's finished work. Works

produce fear and insecurity; grace produces faith and confidence. You don't need another self-help strategy. You need Someone. Jesus is the only fix that lasts forever. Stop trying to manage your addiction and surrender it to the One who can cure it completely.

Reflection Question: What temporary fix keeps pulling you away from the eternal solution?

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## **Day 4: The Target Is God's Will**

Reading: Matthew 6:25-34

Devotional: "The target for us is God's will." When you shoot without a target, you're dangerous. Many believers live aimlessly, pursuing their own plans while claiming to follow Christ. Jesus taught us to seek first God's kingdom and righteousness—everything else becomes secondary. This requires renewed vision. Over time, our spiritual sight gets blurry. We forget what mattered when we first met Jesus. We become "mature and professional believers" who've lost the fire. What if every Sunday was a revival? What if we re-upped our commitment weekly, signing up again with fresh passion? God's will isn't a burden to discover—it's a target that brings clarity to every decision. When you know the target, you stop wasting shots. Seek His kingdom first today. Let everything else find its proper place.

Reflection Question: Is God's will or your own agenda driving your decisions?

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## **Day 5: Never Alone—The Hope That Sustains**

Reading: Hebrews 13:5-6

Devotional: "There's one thing that the believer can say that no one else in the world can say: I am never alone." This is the believer's unique testimony. Through mountaintops and valleys, cancer and loss, brokenness and restoration—God walks with us. The world offers happiness dependent on circumstances; Christ offers joy that transcends them. With works-based religion, there's constant anxiety: "Have I done enough?" With grace, there's unshakeable security: "Jesus did it all." You cannot be more secure than you are in the arms of Christ. He's been your fourth man in the fire time after time. An appointment is coming that we'll all keep—standing before Almighty God. Are you ready? Not through frantic preparation at the last minute, but through daily surrender now. Jesus is coming back. That's not a threat; it's a promise of hope. Live today in light of that eternal reality.

Reflection Question: How does knowing you're never alone change how you face today's challenges?

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Closing Prayer: *Father, renew our vision. Help us fix our eyes on eternal things—on Your will, Your kingdom, Your Son. Break our addiction to temporary fixes and draw us to the permanent solution found only in Jesus. Transform our minds, revive our hearts, and help us live as living sacrifices. We re-up our commitment today. In Jesus' name, Amen.*
