## Pt. 1 – Four Friends on a Mission

Mk.2:1 A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that He had come home. <sup>2</sup>So many gathered that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and He preached the word to them. <sup>3</sup>Some men came, bringing to Him a paralytic, carried by four of them... <sup>5</sup>When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." <sup>6</sup>Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves, <sup>7</sup>"Why does this fellow talk like that? He's blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"... <sup>8</sup>and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things? <sup>9</sup>Which is easier: to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your mat and walk'? <sup>10</sup>But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins...." This amazed everyone and they praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

## **Lessons from the four friends:**

1. No one celebrated the bigger miracle – forgiveness.

Forgiveness is not a bonus, it's our greatest need.

2. The four friends didn't receive a reward.

The reward for serving others is a miracle in their lives.

3. I need to be more <u>passionate</u>, <u>creative</u> and <u>determined</u> about bringing people to Jesus.

My <u>effort</u> + Jesus' <u>power</u> = someone else's miracle.

4. The paralyzed man was <u>excluded</u> by the crowd, <u>included</u> by his friends, and <u>welcomed</u> by Jesus.

Don't ever exclude someone Jesus is ready to welcome.
