Will Winter, horn

Will Winter studied horn with Jennifer Masciulli and Patrick Smith prior to winning a music scholarship to Davidson College, where he studied with Frank Portone. Mr. Winter earned his Bachelor of Arts in Music at Davidson in 2007. He has performed regionally and abroad with orchestras, chamber ensembles, and theater productions. Mr. Winter has been featured as soloist with orchestra in the concerti of Mozart and Strauss, as well as his own *Divertimento* (2020). He is a member of the Gainesville Orchestra horn section, and holds the horn position with the Gainesville Brass Quintet. Mr. Winter's instrumental arrangements and horn playing are featured in the albums of Indie bands Oh Fortuna and Morningbell, and solo artist Daniel Rochelle Jr. Additional albums are in production. Mr. Winter sings tenor and countertenor with the Holy Trinity Choir in Gainesville, Florida.

Tania Moldovan, violin

A native of Romania, violinist Tania Moldovan started playing at the age of six. She is an active orchestral and chamber musician performing extensively in the south east. She performs regularly with the Charleston Symphony, Pensacola Symphony, Venice Symphony, and Orlando Philharmonic. She is co-founder of Chroma, a chamber music series based in Gainesville, which focuses on performing in unconventional spaces. Tania participated in numerous festivals such as the National Music Festival, Eastern Music Festival, Taneycomo Music Festival, Ionian Music Festival in Greece, and St. Augustine Music Festival. She performed internationally in Germany, France, Greece, China, and more recently in Japan. She holds a Masters in violin performance from Bowling Green State University and a DM from Florida State University. Tania maintains a private studio in Gainesville and in her free time enjoys making jewelry for her small business Aniela Designs.

Chris Goddard, piano

Christopher Goddard is a Canadian pianist, organist, and composer. He has performed internationally at the Samos Young Artist Festival and Lucerne Festival Academy and has collaborated with groups such as the Wet Ink Ensemble, Columbia Composers, and Ensemble Moto Perpetuo. As a composer he has collaborated with NYO Canada, Esprit Orchestra, the Nouvel Ensemble Moderne, Continuum Ensemble and others. His work has been recognized by the Graham Sommer Competition for Young Composers and the Friends of Canadian Music Award, and has been broadcast on CBC Radio 2 and BBC Radio 3. He holds a Masters in contemporary piano performance from the Manhattan School of Music and a D.Mus. in composition from McGill University. He currently serves as assisting organist at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church.
