**LENT 2024 BEGINS...**A time of repentance and the imposition of ashes.

ASH WEDNESDAY developed in early medieval times as a day of penitence to mark the beginning of Lent - the forty days of preparation for the celebration of the death and resurrection of our Lord. The ashes are from the burned palm branches of last year's Palm Sunday and imposed on the forehead, are a reminder of our mortality, that we are created "out of the dust of the earth" and that it is only by God's grace that we are given everlasting life.

Taking time to breathe in the peace of Christ through prayer is an essential spiritual practice for all of us. With this in mind, we hope you'll take the opportunity to visit the quiet, sacred space set up in the Fellowship Hall which includes a PRAYER LABYRINTH.

> Prayer labyrinths were a feature of many medieval cathedrals and have been a part of the Christian tradition for centuries. Unlike a maze, they have only one path - there are no dead ends and is a model or metaphor for life. The Christian life is often described as a pilgrimage or journey with God, a journey in which we can grow closer in relationship with God, and in turn, closer to others.

The Fellowship Hall will be open for those who would like to experience prayer by walking the labyrinth after the service tonight and on the following days:

- Thursday: 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. 7:30 p.m. Friday: 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m. Sunday: 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.

This year's **Lenten devotional book**, "The Sanctuary for Lent", is available on the Welcome Table in the Narthex, along with a Labyrinth meditation that can be used throughout the season.
