Text:

Behold the Rest that sets you apart

Ex. 31:12 ¶ And the LORD said to Moses,

Ex. 31:13 "You are to speak to the people of Israel and say, '**Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths, for this is a sign between me** and you throughout your generations, **that you may know that I, the LORD, sanctify you**.

lev 25:1-7 (it is not about a day) Rom 14:5-7 (about devotion) col 2:16-19 (about dependency) heb 4:1-16 (its about relationship - Behold the rest that sets you apart)

Behold the restriction that reveals your heart

Ex. 31:14 You shall keep the Sabbath, because it is **holy for you**. Everyone who profanes it shall be **put to death**. Whoever does any work on it, that soul shall be **cut off** from among his people. Ex. 31:15 Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of **solemn rest, holy to the LORD**. Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day shall be **put to death**.

lev 26:27-34
-> 2 Chron 36:17-21 (rest seems hard - self sufficiency)
neh 10:28-31 (after captivity)
neh 13:15-22 (so enforced it but missed the point)
lk 6:1-11; 13:10-17; 14:1-6 (not an exercise in restriction...so what is it about?)
(Jn 18:28; 19:31 (kept sabbath as they murdered the Sabbath Himself)
lk 10:38-42 (Martha couldn't see the flaw in her priorities)
matt 6:25-34 (behold the restrictions that reveal your heart)
(rom 3:19-20 sabbath restrictions meant to reveal sin
(gal 3:23-24 (the Sabbath restrictions meant to lead them to Christ)

Behold the refreshment promised from the start

Ex. 31:16 Therefore **the people of Israel** shall keep the Sabbath, observing the Sabbath throughout their generations, as **a covenant forever**.

(gal 2:15-21 (not about restriction but devotion)

Ex. 31:17 It is a sign forever between me and the people of Israel that in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed.""

Ex. 31:18 ¶ And he gave to Moses, when he had finished speaking with him on Mount Sinai, the **two tablets** of the testimony, tablets of stone, written with the **finger of God**.

2 Sam 16:5-14 (this is rest)

matt 11:28-30 (its not a day, its not a ritual - its a person - He is the answer to your anxiety- He is the real refreshment in this time of uncertainty

He is the rest promised since the creation of the World

"You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." —-Augustine

rest or die

rom 15:30-33 (ours is not a disembodied refreshment - it has a presence)

acts 20:7; (when Christians began worshipping on Sundays it did not make

Sunday the christian sabbath - the Christian Sabbath is Lord Jesus Christ Himself and Sundays was a way to gather under this new distinction)

Its not about a day Its not about a restriction Its about a refreshment promised since the foundation of the earth - this is what it means to come together IN Christ!!!
